- Ecological meltdown → a "crisis of civilization"

## Is sociology in crisis?

Sociology is challenged from all sides:

- > Reactionary actors
- > Authoritarian leaders
- > Social media, fake news
- > A Eurocentric discipline
- > False claim of universalism

#### **Decolonial sociology**

- A normative project? (democratize sociology)
  - Improve methodologies to conduct our fieldwork
  - Epistemology & false universalism
  - More robust concepts adapted to local and global realities
  - Decrease epistemological biases
  - Research Ethic

Ex: Social capital, En & Aidagara (Y. Sato, 2010)

"Why is social capital, not aidagara, en, or guanxi, the universal sociological concept that describes social relations?".

"a strategy to combine particularism and universalism in sociology".

  Green Energy or "good life" with less consumerism?

Brazil: A new generation of researchers from different background

## Global Sociology

From Americanization of sociology (Oomen, 1992) to the challenge of Eurocentrism and including sociologies from the East and the Souths

"Provincialize Europe" (Chakrabarty, 2000)

Decolonial approach: "not essentialist, not an anti-European critique. It is a perspective critique of Eurocentric and Third World fundamentalisms, colonialism, and nationalism." (Grosfoguel, 2012)

#### "Pluriversalism" instead of universalism?

Pluralism, relativism & parochial localism vs. increasing interdependency
